RAILROAD BED OPEN

Again this season, the railroad bed from Groveton to Jefferson has been made available to snowmobilers. The decking has been put down on the trestle which goes over the Upper Ammonoosuc River in Groveton. As long as there is enough snow, the groomers will be keeping it smooth. This trail provides snowmobilers with faster access from Groveton to points south and great access to the lodging, eating establishments and other snowmobile friendly businesses along Route 3 from Groveton to Lancaster.
